# **Question:**

# Can anyone keep the law of God perfectly?

## **Answer:**

Since the fall, no human has been able to keep the law of God perfectly.

#### What's the worst

Make a list of all the crimes you can think of. Once you've got a list put them in order from the least offensive to the most offensive. Ask them where they would put themselves on the list. They might say they've not done any of those crimes! Reassure them you know they haven't broken the law! But ask them whether they've broken God's law. Where would they be on the list now? We're all equally guilty! We should all be right at the top! We can't keep God's Law and so we need someone who did perfectly keep it!

### **Perfect Score**

Ask your children how they did on their last test as school, did they get 100%? If they did, ask do they always get 100%? If you have young children ask if they think your house is dirty or clean. Even if it is tidy, have a look for some dust, maybe on top of a shelf or under the sofa. It's not perfect. We aren't always perfect. With tests it's fine that we just try our best. When it comes to God's law we need to keep it perfectly, but we can't. God will punish those who have broken his law. But Jesus did keep it perfectly and Jesus takes our place for that punishment for those who trust in him.
